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General Fair Rules and Instructions

- All are invited and welcome to exhibit: Grange membership and East Hartford residency not required.
- Juniors are those exhibitors 15 years of age or younger.
- For the health and safety of the community, all exhibits of flowers, vegetables, fruit and baked goods will not be returned to exhibitors. Other exhibits need to be picked up at end of fair.
- Mail in entry forms for exhibits must be received by one week before the fair to ensure exhibit space. Mail entry forms to Hillstown Grange c/o Michelle DeDominicis, 56 Hills Street, East Hartford, CT 06118. Email kma.dedominicis@gmail .com
- Drop off of exhibits can be made on the Thursday before the fair. Exhibit should be delivered ready for display. Members of grange will be there to meet exhibitors and collect exhibits.
- Judging will be September 10, 2021. By the selected judges.
- See each entry category for requirements; as to the number required and form requested. Best Collection is a minimum of three varieties of a specific class. As an example; tomatoes, one could have a Better Boy, Cherokee Purple and Black Cherry as a Best Collection.
- No entry in any department or class will receive the 1st prize blue ribbon unless deemed worthy by the judges. There can be duplicate prizes awarded within any class.
- Your fair premium will be awarded upon pickup.
- All entries must be the property of the exhibitor and either made or grown by the exhibitor during the last 12 months.
- No more than one entry in any one class may be made by an individual exhibitor.
- Please check each department's rules prior to entering exhibits- there may be additional criteria.
- No person shall be a judge in any department or class in which they may be an exhibitor.
- Decisions of the judges are FINAL! No person shall interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties.
- Entries must be picked up at the end of the fair. Vegetables, flowers, baked and canned goods will be disposed of if not retrieved.



Helpful Hints to Prepare Your Entries for Judging and to Win that Ribbon!

VEGETABLES, HERBS, FRUIT,

Appearance and color are very important. Strive to submit entries that are firm and fresh, i.e. of excellent "market quality." Uniform size and shape are very important. The judges will be the only people to handle the exhibits, carefully checking for bruises and blemishes. Pick the fruitor vegetables as close to the Fair date as possible to ensure freshness!

CANNING (Use Premium Produce)

Bruised or blemished products can be unpredictable during preservation-especially when it comes to appearance and texture. Take extra care in packing produce into the jar. Avoid particles and cloudiness-careful slicing, picking out fragments and broken pieces and not over-processing will help to ensure a consistent, show quality product. Use of a clean lid and new ring suggest that it was perfectly handled during processing. Be sure that the proper headspace is maintained for the contents, size of jar, and processing method. Be sure that you have enough liquid present to completely cover the contents. Follow processing times and methods from a modern source. Strive for consistency-not too solid, not too runny.

Use Premium Produce: Bruised or blemished products can be unpredictable during preservation – especially when it comes to appearance & texture. Take extra care with how you pack your produce into your jars. A clean lid and new rings suggest that it was perfectly handled during processing.

ADVICE FOR TAKING YOUR DIGITAL PHOTO

Find a location that is well lit with even light, for example, near a window, but not in direct sunlight. When you take the photo, try to make your entry as large as possible in the picture. Make sure it is in focus. The goal is to have your entry presented to the judges in as clear an image as possible. Remember it is a requirement to mat all picture entries.

FLOWERS

Appearance is very important. Try to submit blossoms of uniform size and development, stems of similar length and with good quality leaves. If a leaf has a hole in it, carefully remove it by pulling it off down the stem, or carefully cutting it off with a knife blade. Submit what the exhibit requires. Pick the flowers as close to the Fair date as possible to ensure freshness!
